

Gyula Eres is a senior research staff member in the Materials Science and Technology Division of Oak Ridge National Laboratory. He received a Ph.D. in chemical physics from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign in 1985. His thesis research in photochemical dynamics of small molecules was performed under the guidance of Prof. James D. McDonald. His postdoctoral research in UV laser induced photochemical thin film growth of metals and semiconductors was performed in Prof. Joe E. Greene's group at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. In 1987 he joined the Solid State Division of Oak Ridge National Laboratory. His current research interests are focused on real-time studies of the kinetics and mechanisms of elementary surface processes in the growth and properties of epitaxial films and nanostructured materials. He has extensive expertise in studying molecular beam based thin film growth processes including pulsed laser deposition and supersonic molecular beam epitaxy, using advanced surface characterization and surface modification methods such as optical reflectivity, surface x-ray diffraction and resistless electron beam lithography.
